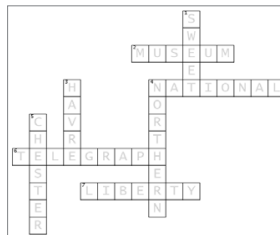
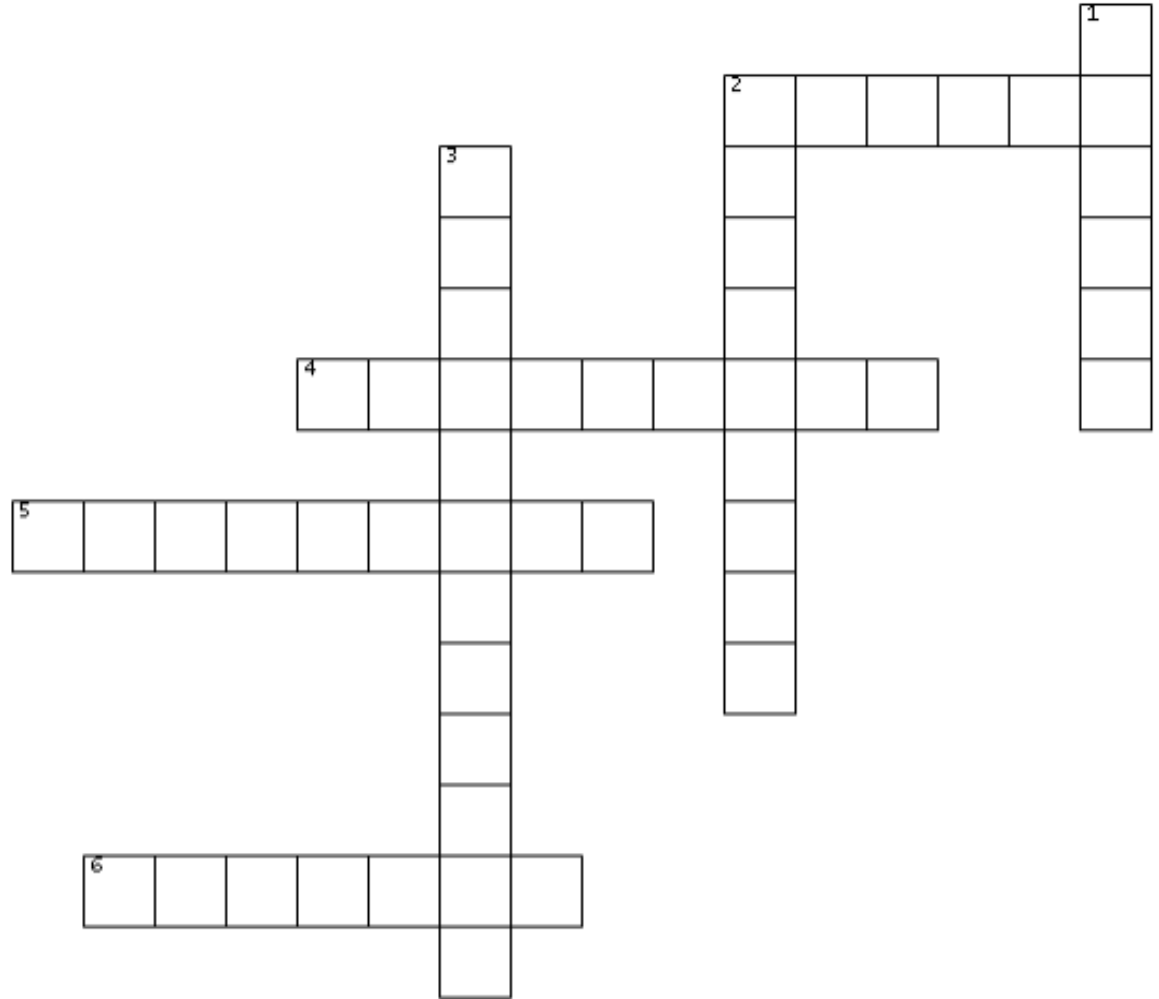
HARLOWTON CROSSWORD CLUES

DISHING UP MONTANA'S BEST RECIPES

RECIPE

Cashew Green Beans

From the Recipes & Remembrances from the HCE/Triangle Relay for Life Team (2008)

INGREDIENTS

- 1 ½ lbs. fresh green beans
- 3 Tbsp butter
- ½ tsp. fresh ground pepper
- ¼ cup fresh parsley, finely chopped
- 1 cup dry roasted cashews

DIRECTIONS

Trim and cut green beans into a 1 ½ inch pieces. Cook green beans in rapidly boiling water with salt in it. Cook until just tender (about 10 minutes). Drain, immerse in ice water, drain again, and set aside. In a medium saucepan, melt butter over medium-low heat. Add pepper and parsley and stir to blend. Add reserved beans and cook until thoroughly heated. Transfer to warm serving bowl and top with cashews.

RECIPE

Sour Cream Chocolate Cake

From HCE/Triangle Cooking for a Cure Cookbook

CAKE INGREDIENTS

- 3 cups sugar
- ¾ cups butter
- 3 eggs
- 4 ½ squares unsweetened chocolate, melted
- 3 ¾ cups flour, sifted
- 1 ½ tsp. baking soda
- 1 ½ cups sour cream
- 1 ½ tsp. vanilla
- 1 ½ cups boiling water

DIRECTIONS

Cream together sugar and butter. Mix in eggs. Stir in melted chocolate. Slowly add the flour, soda, and sour cream, alternating between the flour and sour cream. Gently mix in the vanilla and boiling water. Pour into a 9 x13 inch pan and bake at 350° for 35-40 minutes.

FUDGE FROSTING INGREDIENTS

- ½ cup butter
- 2 squares unsweetened chocolate
- 2 cups sugar
- ⅔ cup milk, or canned condensed milk
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- ½ tsp. salt

DIRECTIONS

Mix ingredients in a saucepan and bring to a boil. After boil, turn down and cook to soft boil stage, 225° to 235°. Don't stir while cooking. Cook to 150°. Add vanilla and salt. Hand beat until gloss is gone and it is spreadable.

RECIPE

Triple Layer Slow Cooker Lasagne

From HCE/Triangle Cooking for a Cure Cookbook

INGREDIENTS

- 1 lb. extra lean ground beef
- 1 (14 ½ oz.) can diced tomatoes
- 1 sm. onion, finely chopped
- 1 cup mushrooms, sliced
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 9 no-boil lasagna noodles
- 1 (28 oz.) jar spaghetti sauce
- 2 (16-oz.) cups fat-free cottage cheese
- 2 cups reduced fat mozzarella cheese, shredded

DIRECTIONS

In a large nonstick skillet over medium heat, combine beef, tomatoes, onion, mushrooms, and garlic. Cook until meat is no longer pink. Coat slow cooker with cooking spray. Place 3 noodles, side by side, in the bottom of the cooker. Top with 1/3 of the spaghetti sauce, 1/3 of the beef mixture and 1/3 of the cheeses. Repeat layers two more times ending with mozzarella. Sprinkle parmesan on top. Cover and cook on low for 4 to 6 hours or until lasagna is hot and cheese is bubbly.

TELEMARKETING CALL SCREENING IS FREE!

Triangle Communications is excited to announce that all our residential phone members will now have telemarketing call screening for FREE, it was previously \$5 a month.

Triangle will offer this service to all of you starting 10/1/2023. This is an Opt-In program and once you enable the telemarketing call screening, it will stop calls from coming into your phone if they do not press "1" to get through before you answer the call.

Below is a limited FAQ on how to use the feature and more are available on our website and in your phone book.

HOW TO ENABLE TELEMARKETING CALL SCREENING:

Dial *95 and from the main menu press "6".

Once enabled, how will it affect people calling me?

Once you enable the feature on your line, the first time someone calls you they will receive a call screening message. After they get the message the first time, and press "1" when prompted by the call screening message, they will not need to do so again when calling from that number.

What numbers should I add before they call?

If you receive any automated calls, you need to ask them what number they call from and manually whitelist these numbers. Examples would be notifications from schools, emergency services, work, etc.

How do I add numbers before they call me, so they do not receive the call screening message?

Dial *95 to access the main menu and press "4" to add numbers to your known list. After pressing "4", you will be prompted to add the number to your list of allowed callers. Please make sure you press all ten (10) digits for the number you are adding. You will receive a confirmation recording that the number was added. After the recording plays, you will be taken back to the main menu. To add another number, repeat the steps above.

What can I do if a telemarketer call makes it through the initial screening?

After hanging up the phone with them, press "0" and they will be added to the blocked list.

TRIANGLE'S 69TH ANNUAL MEETING OF MEMBERS



Triangle's 69th Annual Meeting of Members was held on Saturday, October 7th at the Student Union Building on the campus of MSU-Northern. The meeting was called to order at 10:00 am.

Richard Swartz, Vice President, gave the invocation.

Richard Stuker, President of the Triangle Board, welcomed all the member is attendance to the meeting including guests Montana State Senator Russ Tempel, Hill County Electric Trustee Nick Siebrasse and past Triangle trustee, Verlin Reichelt. President Stuker also led the attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Stuker talked about the history of Triangle Telephone and what a strong advocate Tom Bangs has been for the Cooperative. Triangle's acquisition of the former US West exchanges tied the Triangle north and south exchanges together allowing Triangle to begin the fiber to the home projects across our service area. Had Triangle not pushed to get mobile and fixed wireless, other cooperatives and the bigger companies wouldn't have. Over the years Tom held the President, Vice President, and Treasurer positions on the Triangle Board.



CEO Craig Gates shared that the Triangle Board decided to hold one Annual Meeting in Havre this year. In place of a second meeting Triangle has been holding events called Bits & Bytes. These events are held to keep our membership informed

on how the Cooperative is doing. Triangle held these events at the same time as football games in Big Timber and Harlowton, where both schools playing were served by Triangle to reach more of our members.

Mr. Gates also shared that the FCC gave Triangle the opportunity to take a different form of Universal Service Funding in the form of a new program called Enhanced A-CAM. The funding model gives Triangle certainty on

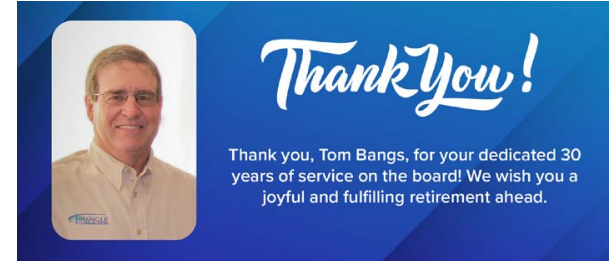


a level of support for 15 years. It will also help the Cooperative to complete our remaining fiber to the home projects. The fiber to the home projects being constructed in 2023 include South Chester, Geraldine, and portions of the Big Timber exchange. Hays, Martinsdale, Springdale, plus the final section of Big Timber are planned to be completed in 2024.

Also announced by Mr. Gates, was that after last year's questions about robocalls, the Board elected to give all members Telemarketing Call Screening free of charge, starting on October 1. It has been added to member's accounts to be activated by them at any time you wish, free of charge.

Prize drawings were held for members in attendance.

Triangle also held an election for District 1 and District 3. Rich Swartz was the sole candidate for District 1 and Eric Hanson



and Michael Ladenburg were nominated for District 3. All three Trustee nominees were present and spoke to the membership. Mail-in ballots and votes from members at the meeting determined the outcome. The results were as follows:

CEO MESSAGE

SAVE A LIFE: AVOID DISTRACTIONS WHILE DRIVING

While driving, we typically hear that “ding” on our phone, alerting us to a text or call coming through, and we sometimes feel the urgent need to check it. We know we shouldn’t, but we reason that we’re going to make an exception—just this once.

So, why do we indulge in behavior we know to be wrong, dangerous and in many states, illegal? Call it hubris. According to AAA research, most people feel they are better-than-average drivers. After all, we have busy lives and are accustomed to multitasking. But mounds of research and thousands of deaths every year prove otherwise.

The reality is that using a phone while driving creates potential for injuries

and fatalities. Distractions take a motorist’s attention off driving, which can make a driver miss critical events, objects and cues, potentially leading to a crash.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, one of every 10 fatal crashes in the U.S. involves distracted driving, resulting in more than 3,000 deaths annually. I find this statistic heartbreaking considering so many of these accidents could easily be avoided if we’d simply put down our phones while driving.

Distracted driving is considered any activity that diverts our attention, including texting or talking on the phone without being hands-free, and adjusting the navigation or entertainment system. Texting is by far one

of the most dangerous distractions. Sending or reading one text takes your eyes off the road for an average of five seconds. At 70 mph that is one tenth of a mile. That is a lot of roads covered without any eyes on the road or hands covering the wheel of the vehicle.

In addition to refraining from texting while driving, we can help keep the roads

safe by moving over for first responders and other emergency and utility vehicles. If you see utility crews conducting work near the roadside, it is now the law in Montana that you must move over and slow down and give them extra space to perform their work safely.

At Triangle Communications, safety is foremost in everything we do—for our employees and the members of the communities we serve. It is Triangle Communications’ policy that there will be no texting and driving. We routinely remind our crews of the dangers of distracted driving, and we hope you’ll have similar conversations with your teens who may be new to the roadways and are especially susceptible to the lure of technology.

Let’s work together to keep everyone safe on the roads. **Remember: that text can wait and waiting just might save a life. If it is that important, pull over in a safe spot, stop the vehicle, read the text and return the text if necessary before you get back on the road.**

Don’t put your life or others’ lives in danger.
